Insights on a Career in the Foreign Service II

After an informative event with the Selingers in Fall 2008, PREEA has invited Mr. and Mrs. Selinger back for another discussion about their experience in the Foreign Service. For many of you who recently completed the FSOT, this will be a great opportunity to ask more questions and decide if a career in the Foreign Service might be for you!

Kirsten Brooks Selinger is a career Foreign Service Officer, who served in political, economic, and consular sections overseas, focusing primarily on post-conflict issues. She has served in Albania, Trinidad and Tobago, and most recently, in Croatia, and focused on a range of issues from preventing terrorist financing and money laundering, to promoting refugee return and managing projects on demining, law enforcement, and war crimes prosecution. Ms. Selinger holds a B.A. in Political Science and French from Washington University and speaks French and Croatian. She is married to fellow Foreign Service Officer Tom Selinger.

Tom Selinger is a career Foreign Service Officer with 8 years of overseas experience, serving as the political-military officer in the U.S. Embassies in Croatia and Albania. Mr. Selinger worked to promote regional stability through military cooperation, NATO integration, weapons stockpile reduction, war crimes prosecution, and border security. He headed the Immigrant Visa and American Citizen Services sections at the Embassy in Trinidad and Tobago. Mr. Selinger holds a B.A. in Journalism from Drake University and speaks French and Croatian.
